Free School Meal

We are pleased to remind you that all pupils at our Infant School are eligible to receive a free hot lunch every school day, courtesy of the Universal Free School Meal (UFSM) program. In addition, families meeting specific criteria can qualify for Free School Meals (FSM), which also provides our school with additional support from the Local Authority.

For families eligible under the FSM program, the Local Authority is currently providing vouchers to cover the cost of lunches throughout the school holidays, including the upcoming 6-week summer break. To access this support, please apply directly via the following link: Free School Meals Application

Eligibility Criteria:

- The child must be in full-time education at a local authority funded institution and must be present for full days.
- The child must reside with a parent or guardian receiving one of the qualifying benefits.

Please note, applications for free school meals are not processed by the school. Use the link provided above to submit your application directly.

Currently free school meal pupils receive weekly vouchers to cover the cost of lunches during the holiday period at approx. £14.00 per week, this is at the Local Authority's discretion.


Gentle reminder to complete our two current surveys on service families and young carers. Together, we will make a difference to our children.
