Christianity

Christianity is one of the five main world religions. It began after the death of **Jesus**.

Jesus was born a Jew and **Christianity** originally developed as part of **Judaism**.

There are a number of symbols associated with **Christianity**:



The words 'Christian' and '**Christianity**' come from the name, '**Jesus** Christ.'



Judaism began nearly 4,000 years ago in the Middle East. This is a large area on the border of Asia, Africa and Europe.

Jews believe that there is only one **God**. They believe they have a special agreement with God called a **covenant**. Jews promise to obey God's laws to say thank you to him for looking after them. The Jewish holy book is known as the Tanakh or Hebrew Bible.

Hinduism is an Indian religion or dharma, a religious way of life by which followers abide. As a religion, it is the world's third largest.

This is the main symbol associated with Hinduism :



Hinduism beliefs: Dharma (righteousness), Karma (Actions), afterlife and reincarnations.
